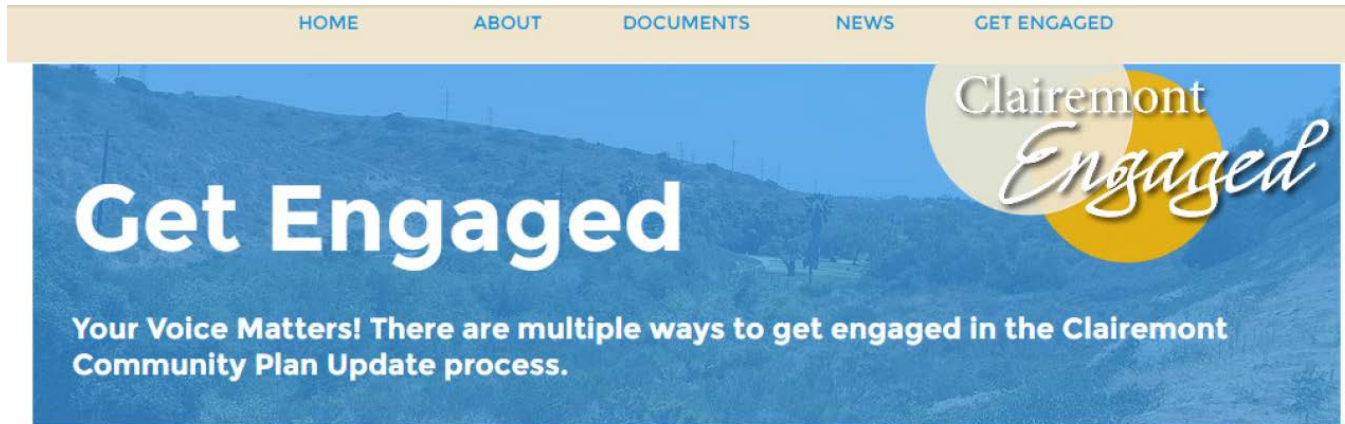

Step 2: Learn About the Guiding Principles

What are Guiding Principles of a Community Plan and why are they needed?

Guiding Principles are a series of broad, community-wide "need statements" that reflect the core values of the community and make up the vision of the community plan. These principles are expressed throughout the community plan as desired outcomes. These statements form the foundation of plan goals and recommendations, inform land use decisions, and provide a point of reference when it comes to considering plan policies.

Who creates the Guiding Principles and when will they be created?

The community is being asked to prioritize and provide input regarding the Guiding Principles for the new Clairemont Community Plan. As a starting point, City Planning staff has come up with a set of draft guiding principles based on an evaluation of the adopted Clairemont Mesa Community Plan and previous input by the Clairemont Mesa Planning Committee's Visioning Task Force.

A report-out on the results will be provided at the Community Plan Update Ad-hoc Subcommittee meeting in March and posted online at www.clairemontplan.org.
