Conservation Element Draft Goals

 Protection and enhancement of canyons, hillsides, and dedicated open space for their ecological diversity and opportunities for trails

Protection of public views to natural resources



Conservation Element Draft Goals (Continued)

 Incorporation of sustainable storm water management techniques to capture runoff and reduce impacts to the canyon network

 Incorporation of sustainable building, landscape, and development techniques to reduce dependency on non-renewable energy sources, reduce emissions, solid waste, and water consumption


Conservation Element Draft Goals (Continued)

 Reduction of greenhouse gas emission at the community level in a matter that enhances the quality of life and supports the local economy

 Promotion and expansion of the tree canopy along streets and on public and private property.



General Plan: Economic Prosperity Element



Purpose:

 To increase wealth and the standard of living of all San Diegans with policies that support diverse, innovative, competitive, entrepreneurial, and sustainable local economy

Focus on industrial and commercial areas

General Plan: Economic Prosperity Element



Prime Industrial Land

- Support export-oriented base sector activities such as warehouse distribution, heavy or light manufacturing, R&D
- Intended to protect valuable employment land for base sector industries
- Residential and some commercial, institutional uses restricted



General Plan: Economic Prosperity Element

Prime Industrial Land Criteria - Appendix C, EP-1

- Designated industrial
- Restrictive industrial zoning
- Market feasibility
- Predominantly developed
- Developable with industrial uses
- Free from non-industrial encroachment
- Proximity to resources of extraordinary value



Clairemont Community Plan (1989)

Industrial Element Primary Goal:

 Provide new, high quality office and industrial park development within the community and rehabilitate older office and industrial development



Clairemont Community Plan (1989)

Objectives:

1. Redevelop and rehabilitate the industrial uses along Santa Fe Street and Morena Boulevard in order to improve the physical appearance, landscaping, offstreet parking and circulation.

2. Increase employment opportunities.




Clairemont Community Plan (1989)

Objectives (continued):

- 3. Decrease potential land use conflicts between industrial and residential or commercial development.
- 4 Design signs that are an integral part of a development project that are informative and compatible with the scale of surrounding development

Clairemont Industrial Areas



Opportunities

- Potential for high-tech and bio-tech start-ups and smaller size base sector businesses
- Emergence of artisan food and beverage industry

 A diverse mix of community and neighboring serving businesses that provide a variety of goods and services


